Getting started with 'R' – analysing and visualising your statistical data

Content

'R' is a complete, flexible and open source system for statistical analysis which has become a core tool of choice for a wide range of researchers spanning over multiple disciplines. The aim of the present workshop is to give the participants a first step hands-on practical session on the 'R' environment by introducing the principals and most used commands in a practical manner to help them explore, visualize and adapt hypothesis depending on the nature of their datasets.

Learning Objectives

At the end of the course, participants should become comfortable with the R environment and be able to read, understand and write R commands,

- interact with the R environment
- import and summarize data
- explore data with models and graphics
- manipulate data frames
- produce high quality publication level graphics
- statistical hypothesis
