

## Open Access Publishing

### Content

This 3 hour workshop introduces early career researchers to the main issues concerning Open Access publishing and offers them an overview of the major advantages, concerns, possibilities, requirements, and tools associated with Open Access. We will discuss Open Access requirements and mandates from funders; costs associated with Author Processing Charges; the possibilities afforded by repositories and Open Access green, as well as ethical and political arguments and how they can impact researchers' careers.

During the workshop, participants will investigate a variety of Open Access related developments in their academic field including journals, funders, and research tools. The goal of the workshop is to equip participants with a clear notion of how Open Access affects their research, how they can best use it to their advantage, what options are open to them, and where they can find support.

### Learning Objectives

After the workshop, participants know how to realise their publication project in Open Access. They are able to make informed decisions and aware of funders' requirements.
