## **(Post)Doc Programm Transferable Skills – Schlüsselqualifikationen für die universitäre und ausseruniversitäre Laufbahn**

Das Kursprogramm ist komplementär zu dem bestehenden Angebot an der Universität Bern konzipiert und speziell auf die Bedürfnisse der Doktorierenden und Postdoktorierenden ausgerichtet. 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

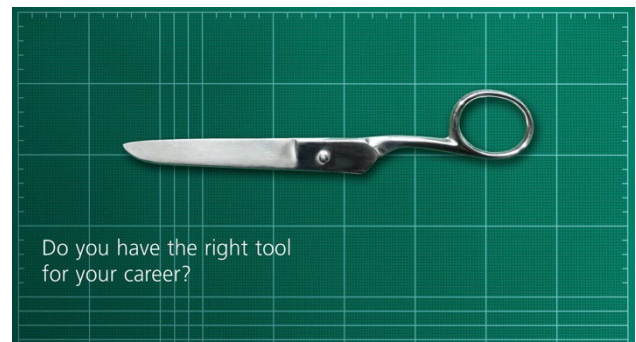

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
